## Report on ICOM-UK Bursary and Camilla Boodle Funds 2018 - 2019

## **Background**

ICOM-UK provides up to £5000 a year to be distributed through the bursary scheme and also has a limited fund that was a donation from Camilla Boodle, a former ICOM-UK member, to provide small funds to ICOM-UK members who wish to visit museums prior to or post a conference.

The last two years has seen a more complicated Bursary Programme. 2018 saw the financial year for ICOM-UK change from being 1<sup>st</sup> January until 31<sup>st</sup> December to October 1<sup>st</sup> - September 30<sup>th</sup>. This had major implications for the ICOM-UK Bursary programme. 2018 had been a very quiet year and if the old financial year was to have continued we would only have had three applicants we would have funded which would have totalled just over £2000. All of these were to attend conferences in September 2018, but one offer was withdrawn as the applicant became uncontactable after moving jobs.

The ICOM-UK Board met and agreed that the unspent funds could be carried forward into the new financial year, something which had not happened in the past. In effect this meant that the Bursary Committee had £10 000 to distribute in bursaries from January 1<sup>st</sup> 2018 until September 30<sup>th</sup> 2019. This decision was taken for several reasons but the main reason was that it allowed additional funds to support members wanting to attend the ICOM Triennial in Kyoto in September 2019.

It should be added here, that the Bursary Committee review the applications based on the date they are received, a first come first served policy. We are therefore not biased by the applicants chosen conference for example. Even with the carry-over of funds from 2018/2019 we were able to only fund 12 applications and after these we were unable to review/fund any applications that followed. We received a further 10 applications, mostly requests for funds to attend the Triennial in Kyoto, which we had no funds for. It is worth noting That ICOM-UK bursaries provided funding for four ICOM-UK members to attend the ICOM Triennial in Kyoto.

This year has also seen a key moment in the relationship between ICOM-UK and the UK Overseas Territories. The Falkland Islands Museum and National Trust who have been institutional members of ICOM-UK for many years received a £1000 bursary to send a staff member to attend a conference in Bermuda. This was also the only institutional application that we received in this present round of applications.

The 12 successful ICOM-UK Bursary applicants will have represented ICOM-UK at 8 different conferences on 4 continents. A condition for each Bursary recipient is that they write a report and these reports from those who attend the conferences they are uploaded onto the ICOM-UK website which provides our members with further information on each of these conferences and what our applicants did.

In total we distributed just slightly less than £10000 budget we had for 2018-2019 combined financial years.

Please note that Bursary Applications are open for attendance at conferences and we still have some funds left for this financial year. Please remember that people can already apply for conferences that happen after October 1<sup>st</sup> 2020 and these will come out of next year's budgets.

Here is a list of the successful applicants and the conferences they have attended or are planning to attend. If they all claim the full amounts we have agreed then the total Bursary spend for January  $1^{st}$  2018-October  $30^{th}$  2019 will be £9999.51.
