	confirmed ICOM UK will continue to work	
	closely with ACE's international strategy.	
	Up to 2020, ICOM UK's membership had been	
	one of consistent growth. The pandemic has	
	changed this. The report reassured members	
	that ICOM UK finances were stable and that a	
	return to membership growth in the future	
	was entirely possible.	
	TN then reported to members that her new	
	role at ACE had prompted the difficult decision	
	to step down as ICOM UK Chair. She thanked	

ICOM UK for the opportunity to work with members and the committee. TN stressed the importance of ICOM in the international sector and also the importance of the ICOM museum definition process. TN acknowledged there were critics of the definition process but her view was that the definition would provide an important platform for the global museum sector. She urged members to keep an open mind about the process.

TN then reviewed the 2021-2 Forward Plan, written with Christian Baars and Catherine McDermott who, subject to the meeting vote, are the proposed Co-Chairs.

The Forward plan also updated the meeting with the Governance Review process which started prior to the pandemic and had now resumed, with the move to CIO status identified as a priority.

On membership TN outlined the focus will be on rebuilding and returning to membership growth. Communication + Marketing focussed on the website which is no longer not fit for purpose. Funds have been allocated to work on this and deliver the new website in 2022.

A key issue in the Forward Plan was the need for more fundraising and with the majority of Committee members in full time posts, capacity was a concern. ICOM UK will continue to have strong stake holder engagement, for example with ACE and the MA and to engage with ICOM's subcommittees and the forthcoming Prague 2022 Triennial. In addition, the devolved nations will be a priority.

The 2021 Working Internationally Conference was very different and the plan for 2022 is to explore hybrid proposals and venues including Wales.
