Subject	Report on ICOM UK Bursaries 2021 - 2022

Report	Background: ICOM-UK provides up to £5000 a year to be distributed through the bursary scheme. These are awarded to fit into our financial year and runs from October 1 st 2021-September 31 st 2022.
	Following the COVID pandemic when possible international travel was curtailed and there was no prospect of international conferences in person, 2021-2022 saw the return to normality.
	Unfortunately, The COVID pandemic has played havoc with international conferences and this is reflected by our ability to award any grants. As international travel became restricted conferences were either cancelled, postponed or went online. 2022 was also the year for the ICOM Triennial in Prague and, as in other triennial years, we had more applications for bursaries than we had money for.
	In 2021-22 we awarded six Bursaries to attend the ICOM Triennial in Prague:

	All of these were awarded £750 each which meant ICOM-UK awarded £4500 to send 6 delegates to the ICOM Triennial. However some of the delegates did not claim the full amount when submitting their expenses
	On top of these bursaries we also awarded the following bursary:

	Jenny Pistella, Freelance Heritage Learning Consultant (and National rep for the UK for ICOM CECA) to attend ICOM CECA annual conference, 25th – 29th October 2021, in Belgium. Jenny was awarded £400. This meant that for the Financial year 2021-22 we awarded 7 Bursaries, totalling £4,653.32
